

## GILBERT GEIS

Gilbert Geis is a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Criminology, Law and Society at the University of California, Irvine. He is a former president of the American Society of Criminology and recipient of its Edwin H. Sutherland Award for outstanding research. He has also been given research awards by the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners, the Western Society of Criminology, the American Justice Institute, and the National Organization for Victim Assistance.

Geis received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin and his undergraduate degree from Colgate University. He taught at the University of Oklahoma (1952-1957) and California State University, Los Angeles (1957-1972) before joining the Irvine faculty. He has held visiting appointments in the School of Criminal Justice, State University of New York, Albany; the Institute of Criminology, Cambridge University, the Faculty of Law, University of Sydney; and the College of Human Development, Pennsylvania State University. During the fall semester 1996, he was a Distinguished Visiting Professor at John Jay College in New York City.

Geis has published more than 380 books, book chapters and articles on various aspects of crime and criminal justice. His most recent books are A Trial of Witches (with Ivan Bunn); and Crimes of the Century: From Leopold and Loeb to O.J. Simpson (with Leigh Bienen). An Infertility Inferno (with Mary Dodge), a study of an *in vitro* fertilisation scandal, is due out next year.
